<u>Late Registrations</u>: Late registrations may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Organizing Committee. Any late registrations accepted will pay an additional late fee of \$10 per race.

COMPETITIONS

Sask Cup #1 on Saturday, January 21, 2023, is a classic distance race with interval starts. Racers are to be at the race venue on Saturday by 12:30 p.m. for bib pick up and to be ready for the race start at 1:30 p.m. Race office opens 12:00 noon at the Don Allen Trails and will remain open until the day's official results are posted. *This race will also be used for the Team North Saskatchewan Winter Games Trials for Junior 2011, 2010, 2009 (U14 & U12), Senior 2008, 2007, 2006 (U18 & U16) and Para Nordic Sit and Standing (2001-2011).

Sask Cup #2 on Sunday, January 22, 2023, is a free technique distance race with mass starts. Racers are to be at the race venue on Sunday by 10:00 a.m. to be ready for the race start at 11:00 a.m. Race office opens at 9:30 a.m. at the Don Allen Trails and will remain open until the day's official results are posted. *Following the race, a sprint prologue and sprint mass start will be held for the Team North Saskatchewan Winter Games Trials for Junior 2011, 2010, 2009 (U14 & U12), Senior 2008, 2007, 2006 (U18 & U16) and Para Nordic Sit and Standing (2001-2011). VENUE: Don Allen Ski Trail system, located 20 km north of La Ronge on Highway

102 at the junction of Highway 102 & the Nemeiben Lake Road.

RULES: Cross Country Saskatchewan Sask Cup Series Rules (2022-23 version); and FIS ICR - CCR (Canadian Competition Rules) November Precisions 2021. Para Nordic categories will also be governed by Para Nordic International Competition Rules (ICR), October 2022. Sanctioning: Nordiq Canada Tier 2 and Cross Country Saskatchewan.

CANCELLATION: In the event that weather or trail conditions require cancellation of the race(s), the Race Committee will notify Cross Country Saskatchewan by 12PM on Thursday, January 19 if the race(s) must be cancelled.

Races must be cancelled, delayed, or postponed if the temperature on the coldest part of the course is below -20° C. U12 - U8 categories must be cancelled, delayed, or postponed if the temperature on the coldest part of the course is below -15°C.

The Race Committee also reserves the right to modify race format, distances and start times before or on race day due to weather or trail conditions.

Please be careful to register in the correct gender and age categories and to enter NC race license numbers correctly so you are not charged additional fees. Do not enter text comments in the license fields. Nordiq Canada race licenses must be valid for the 2022-23 competition year.

Race Licenses

This event is sanctioned as a Nordiq Canada Tier 2 event so all U16 and older competitors must have a current Nordiq Canada race license valid for the 2022-23 competition season or must purchase a Nordiq Canada Supporting Member Day License at a cost of \$5 per race in addition to race registration fees. Athletes in the U14 and younger categories must have a current Nordiq Canada development license valid for the 2022-23 competition season if they wish to be eligible to earn CPL points. If they do not have this license and are not members of a Nordiq Canada or CCS member club, they are welcome to participate but they must purchase a Nordiq Canada Supporting Member Day License at a cost of \$5 per race in addition to race registration fees.

Citizen Racers (non-CCS Club members) are welcome but must purchase a Nordiq Canada Supporting Member Day License at a cost of \$5 per race in addition to race registration fees, unless: 1) they live in another province or territory and already hold a valid 2022-23 Nordiq Canada license or development license, or 2) they are in the U14 and younger age categories and a member of a Nordiq Canada or CCS member club.

Competitors holding a valid Nordiq Canada licenses will receive preferential seeding.

Waivers: All competitors must sign a waiver as part of the online Zone4 registration. Competitors under 19 years of age must have this waiver signed by a parent or guardian.

Race Office Opens: 9:30am Course Closes: 10:45am Race Start: 11:00am **Draw:** Start order for U8 to U12 will be determined by random draw. Start order for U14 and older will be determined in two groups: 1) NC license and development license racers will be given preferential seeding with start order determined by CPL points; and 2) non-NC licensed racers and citizen racers will be grouped together in a random draw.

Unofficial Results and Protests: Unofficial results will be posted at the race office. The time of posting will be marked on the unofficial results. Any protests must be made to the Competition Secretary within 15 minutes of the unofficial results being posted, after which the results will be declared official.

Awards

Ribbons: Ribbons for 1st, 2nd and 3rd will be awarded to racers in all categories at the race stadium at the close of the races.

Cash Prizes: Racers in U16 Boys/Girls, U18 Boys/Girls and U20 Men/Women categories will receive cash prizes of \$60 for 1st place, \$45 for 2nd place and \$30 for 3rd place in the classic technique distance races.

Fun Sprints: Fun sprints for all skiers using classic technique will be held in the stadium on Saturday, January 21 after the Sask Cup distance races. Skiers will not earn Sask Cup points for the fun sprints, but the fastest skiers in each category will receive \$10 for 1st place and \$5 for 2nd place.

Racers must be present at the awards ceremony to receive a ribbon or cash prize. However, racers absent from the awards ceremony will maintain their standing in their races and will be awarded any applicable CCS and CPL points.

Wax Policy

Cross Country Saskatchewan follows Nordiq Canada fluoro policy. For the 2022-23 season there will be a full fluoro ban applied for all Nordiq Canada sanctioned events. Details can be found HERE.

Health Concerns





<u>La Ronge Hotel & Suites:</u> Located on La Ronge Avenue (a busy hotel). Phone (306) 425-2190 to confirm rates and book.
